Eight faculty members from the School of Law, one from the College of Education, and one from the College of Criminal Justice Education participated in a short-term faculty exchange.



The Office of International Affairs and Linkages sustained and established five glocalization plans in 2024. One key initiative is the creation of a proforma MOA for international partners, streamlining the process from verifying partner legitimacy to ensuring fair provisions for both TSU and its collaborators. Additionally, a Selection Criteria for International Travels was developed to provide fair opportunities for TSU employees to participate in international engagements.

Other efforts include the Creation of the Times Higher Committee, which focuses on TSU's qualification for international rankings, and the Institutionalization of IZN Plans for Colleges and Offices, ensuring all university units engage in global initiatives. Lastly, TSU has made a formal commitment to qualify for AppliedHE and other international rankings in 2025.






This enhancement introduced new provisions and projects, paving the way for deeper academic cooperation, joint research initiatives, and expanded opportunities for students and faculty.

Additionally, TSU, together with the TSU Alumni Office and the TSU Alumni Singapore Chapter, hosted a seminar for overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) in Singapore, educating them about their rights and labor protections.



With these accomplishments, OIAL continues to



to drive TSU's internationalization efforts forward, fostering meaningful collaborations and expanding opportunities for students and faculty on the global stage.

The Office of International Affairs and Linkages (OIAL) sustained its momentum in global partnerships and academic initiatives from March to July 2024, marking significant achievements in international mobility, student exchange programs, global rankings, and benchmarking activities.

March began with the successful completion of HARMONII 2024, where two TSU students participated in an international mobility program in Indonesia. This opportunity allowed them to engage in meaningful discussions on cultural and religious diversity, further enriching their global perspective. Shortly after, TSU concluded the Short-Term Inbound Student Exchange Program for students from Osaka University of Economics (OUE) marking the completion of their two-week English Language Proficiency Program (ELPP) The program strengthened TSU's academic exchange initiatives and fostered deeper connections with its Japanese partner institution.

A major milestone in TSU's international standing was its recognition in the World's Universities with Real Impact (WURI) 2024 Rankings. TSU secured the 281st overall spot and earned high placements in key categories, ranking 30th in Student Support and Engagement, 39th in Crisis Management, and 52nd in Funding. These rankings underscore the university's commitment to student welfare, institutional resilience, and resource management.

MARCH - JULY

From May to July, OIAL facilitated multiple benchmarking visits, emphasizing TSU's role as a model institution for various academic and administrative programs.

The Cavite State University (CavSU) also conducted a benchmarking visit to TSU-OUES, focusing on extension systems, proposal development, and PMERS.

With these achievements, OIAL continues to drive TSU's internationalization and institutional excellence, strengthening academic partnerships and solidifying the university's reputation as a globally competitive institution.

The Office of International Affairs and Linkages (OIAL) remained steadfast in advancing TSU's internationalization efforts and institutional excellence in August and September 2024. Key initiatives focused on supporting international students, sustaining global memberships, and exploring new collaborations with foreign institutions and organizations.

In August, OIAL facilitated the enrollment and endorsement of International Scholar Sohel Mohamad Naser into the College of Engineering, ensuring a smooth transition into TSU's academic environment.

Additionally, the office processed visa extensions for international students, reaffirming its commitment to student support. TSU also sustained its memberships in prominent global organizations, including the University Mobility in Asia and the Pacific (UMAP) the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) the Association of Universities of Asia and the Pacific (AUAP) and the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) further solidifying its presence in international academic circles.

September was marked by strategic planning and a series of exploratory meetings to expand TSU's global network.

AUGUST - SEPTEMBER



The new OIAL staff assumed office on September 3 and immediately conducted Annual Strategic Planning for FY 2024-2025 in Baguio City, setting the direction for the university's international programs and partnerships.

The office engaged in collaborative discussions with Osaka University of Economics through a meeting with Ms. Janet Oishi, focusing on future academic engagements.



Further exploratory meetings were held with Dr. Ji Young Lee, strengthening TSU's partnerships with Kimpo University, Seoul Theological University, Asia Coffee Union, and Global Cyber University. Another online meeting with the University of Applied Sciences for Health Professions Upper Austria explored potential student exchange programs, expanding opportunities for international mobility. Expanding TSU's global partnerships, OIAL held exploratory meetings with Prof. Mon-Wen of Gumi University and Dr. Ji Young Lee, focusing on funded student training and academic collaborations. Another exploratory meeting with Wanbo Human Resources Service Co. Ltd. explored internship opportunities for TSU students in 5-star hotels in Shanghai, covering logistics, duration, and academic alignment. Additionally, the office provided essential support to foreign students Ms. Bifang Zhou, Ms. Yuqian Du, and Mr. Xiaoxuan Liu in processing their student visa documents, ensuring smooth integration into the university.



TSU reinforced its commitment to refugee education by attending a dinner meeting at EDSA Shangri-La with Dr. Stanley Tan and UNHCR representatives to discuss financial support for CPATH scholars, ensuring sustained assistance for international students in need.





OIAL also assisted foreign students Hongling Wu, Xinxin Wang, and Guanming Lu in processing their student visa documents, ensuring their smooth transition and compliance with local regulations.

To enhance TSU's curriculum and instructional strategies, OIAL, alongside the Office of Quality Assurance (OQA) the Office of Curriculum and Instruction (OCI) and the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs (OVPAA) held a strategic meeting to explore curriculum enhancements that align with global educational standards.



Additionally, a consultation with the Office of the University Legal Counsel (OULC) refined the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) template, which was later approved by the Administrative Council on November 12, 2025.

TSU's international partnerships also progressed with a virtual exploratory meeting with Tarsus University, focusing on student exchange opportunities for the College of Public Administration and Governance, aligning academic strengths with global mobility initiatives.



Meanwhile, TSU formalized its partnership with Hechi University through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signing, reinforcing the institutional collaboration.



In November 2024, the Office of International Affairs and Linkages (OIAL) played a pivotal role in advancing TSU's internationalization efforts through strategic planning, academic collaborations, and student support services.

Dr. Rosete presented the Pipeline Projects for 2025, outlining key initiatives that align with the university's long-term strategic goals, ensuring continuous growth and global competitiveness



As part of its commitment to international mobility, OIAL and the Student Selection Board established clear eligibility criteria for the AYLTLC 2025, promoting fairness and transparency in the student selection process.

Additionally, TSU reinforced its relationship with Hechi University by organizing and facilitating a three-day International Seminar-Workshop on "Teaching Language and Literature in the Age of Al", in collaboration with OGS, COEd, and OIAL.



The Pathways Pilipinas Consortium also progressed as OIAL attended the CPath consultation at San Beda College, contributing to the drafting and finalization of the Terms of Reference, which will define the consortium's structure and governance.

OIAL remained dedicated to assisting international students, retrieving Guanming Liu's ICard and ensuring her smooth departure, while also supporting Mr. Mahmoud Abdelmutaal with his visa extension.

Lastly, an exploratory meeting introduced the Internationalization Plan for MAEd programs, outlining steps to develop partnerships and formal agreements for future academic collaborations. These initiatives reaffirm TSU's commitment to fostering a globally engaged academic environment, providing students and faculty with opportunities for growth and international exposure.



Additionally, during the Internationalization (IZN) Meeting, deans, directors, and IZN coordinators discussed the requirement for colleges and offices to develop their own IZN plans, collate linkages, and propose pipeline projects, reinforcing the university's collective effort toward global engagement. The proposed OIAL databank was also introduced, aiming to centralize and streamline internationalization records.



December 2024 marked another milestone for the Office of International Affairs and Linkages (OIAL) as it strengthened academic collaborations, advanced international mobility programs, and enhanced institutional initiatives.

In preparation for the 5th International Forensic Science Conference, OIAL spearheaded planning meetings, defining conference goals, structure, and logistics.



The meeting also established direct communication channels between Tarlac State University (TSU) and the Tarlac Provincial Government, ensuring seamless coordination and real-time updates. The actual 3-day International Forensic Science Conference, co-organized with the School of Law (SOL) the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) and other university offices, successfully gathered experts, scholars, and practitioners in the field.

OIAL also facilitated key exploratory meetings to establish new collaborations. The meeting with the College of Engineering and Adapt-IP Philippines Inc. explored research partnerships, academic exchanges, student internships, specialized training programs, and community projects.



The discussion identified deliverables such as student engagement in research activities and tangible project outcomes.




